Paul Oman was honored as a *Bold Brush International* Painting Competition finalist for his watercolors in 2010 and 2013, featured in the 2017 *National Watercolor Society's* International Exhibition in San Pedro, CA and has exhibited in other national and regional exhibitions.

Paul paints with watercolor, acrylic, and oil. The fast and free approach of watercolor has become the foundation for how he sees and approaches the visual arts in studio, plein air, and before live audiences. Painting since he was ten years old, Paul works full-time using his artistic abilities to bring hope, inspiration, joy, and value to the lives of other through art and its creative processes.

A native of Amery, WI, Paul is also a drawing and painting instructor, sharing the joy of painting in any medium with people of all ages and abilities through workshops, schools, community education, and by invitation.

"Painting 'into and through' the forest can be a challenge, especially when every little detail wants to be noticed at first glance. I will demonstrate how I simplify these complex patterns, beginning with abstract washes and wet-on-dry applications, working towards the realistic impression that sunlight dancing through the trees of a northern Minnesota forest/lake landscape provides. I will even add a couple of birch trees and reflections for fun! These landscapes in watercolor, among all of the many and varied subjects I paint in various mediums, are among my favorites. I hope you will join me and I look forward to interacting with you."


A Different Pond



Review Me, Please!

Leaving positive reviews on social media - Instagram, Facebook, Etsy, artist's website or blog, et al. - is an inexpensive, powerful way to support your favorite artists.

When you find an artist or a work of art you like, click on a five-star rating, "like" it, or hit that heart emoji; even better, leave a review. Social media platforms have their own etiquette, but basically: Be kind. Be positive. Compliments welcome! Save critical feedback for another venue. Also be sure to ask permission before you re-post another artist's work.

Contributing a positive review not only helps to attract attention to an artist you enjoy but, as one marketing site claims, may even improve that artist's productivity, inspire others, and influence new methods.
