
Alma Woodsey Thomas (1891-1978)

"Through color, I have sought to concentrate on beauty and happiness, rather than on man's inhumanity to man."

Alma Woodsey Thomas (September 22, 1891 – February 24, 1978) was an African American artist and teacher who lived and worked in Washington, D.C., and is now recognized as a major American painter of the 20th century.... She achieved success as an African American female artist despite the segregation and prejudice of her time.... Thomas's reputation has continued to grow since her death. Her paintings are displayed in notable museums and collections, and they have been the subject of several books and solo museum exhibitions. In 2021, a museum sold Thomas's painting "Alma's Flower Garden" in a private transaction for \$2.8 million. ("Alma Thomas." Wikipedia)

What roles have you held as a volunteer?
